Congressional Medal of Honor

Fred Smith: 308th Infantry Regiment, 77th Division



Citation: When communication from the forward regimental post of command to the battalion leading the advance had been interrupted temporarily by the infiltration of small parties of the enemy armed with machineguns, Lieutenant Colonel Smith personally led a party of two other officers and ten soldiers, and went forward to reestablish runner posts and carry ammunition to the front line. The

guide became confused and the party strayed to the left flank beyond the outposts of supporting troops, suddenly coming under fire from a group of enemy machineguns only 50 yards away. Shouting to the other members of his party to take cover this officer, in disregard of his danger, drew his pistol and opened fire on the German gun crew. About this time he fell, severely wounded in the side, but regaining his footing, he continued to fire on the enemy until most of the men in his party were out of danger. Refusing first-aid treatment he then made his way in plain view of the enemy to a hand grenade dump and returned under continued heavy machinegun fire for the purpose of making another attack on the enemy emplacements. As he was attempting to ascertain the exact location of the nearest nest, he again fell, mortally wounded

Congressional Medal of Honor

Nels T. Wold: 138th Infantry Regiment, 35th Division.



Citation: He rendered most gallant service in aiding the advance of his company, which had been held up by machine-gun nests, advancing, with one other soldier, and silencing the guns, bringing with him, upon his return, 11 prisoners. Later the same day he jumped from a trench and rescued a comrade who was about to be shot by a German officer, killing the officer during the exploit. His actions were entirely voluntary, and it was while attempting to rush a fifth machine-gun nest that he was killed. The advance of his company was mainly due to

his great courage and devotion to duty.

THE AMERICAN LEGION FOR GOD AND COUNTRY

The American Legion was chartered by Congress in 1919, evolving from a group of war-weary veterans of World War I into one of the most influential nonprofit groups in the U.S.

As Legion Posts across North Dakota were being formed over the next few years, many communities named them after local soldiers who had died during the Great War. Some examples:

Legion Post #1, Bismarck, is named in memory of Private First Class Loyd Spetz, 164th Infantry Regiment, who was killed on 1 March 1918 while serving with Company K, 18th Infantry Regiment, 1st Infantry Division Posthumously awarded the Silver Star.

Legion Post #2, Fargo, is named for Lieutenant Colonel Gilbert C. Grafton, a 164th Infantry Regiment officer who died in France 5 February 1919 from non-combat surgical complications.

Legion Post #3, Dickinson, is named for Matthew Brew, 164th Infantry Regiment, the first Stark County soldier killed in WW1 on 1 March 1918 after transferring to Company D, 1st Machinegun Battalion, 1st Infantry Division. Posthumously awarded the Silver Star.

NORTH DAKOTA NATIONAL GUARD

In all, 31,269 North Dakotans served in World War I. Of those, 4,195 were the “hometown boys” of the North Dakota National Guard.

The 1st North Dakota Infantry Regiment had proven itself during the Philippine Insurrection, Spanish American War, & Mexican Border Incident, all within the first 27 years of statehood. When the unit was alerted for WWI, the state attempted to form a second ND regiment to join it; the bid failed, with most of the recruits filling the ranks of the 1st ND.

As part of the Army-wide renumbering system for the Expeditionary Forces, the 1st North Dakota Infantry Regiment was renamed the 164th Infantry Regiment, keeping staff, personnel, lineage, and honors of the 1st North Dakota.

The 164th Infantry Regiment was assigned to the 41st Division, a designated replacement division in France. Most of the soldiers of the 164th were transferred to units of the 1st Infantry Division for combat service.

The 164th Infantry Regiment later served in the South Pacific during World War II, & as a training regiment during the Korean War.
