Vet Center History & Locations

- Established in 1979
- Vietnam Vets didn't trust VA
- VA didn't know how to handle the Vietnam Vets
 - Better survivability of combat wounded
 - 1st unpopular war
- Started out as "rap groups"
- ND Locations
 - Bismarck
 - Minot
 - Fargo
 - Outstation in Grand Forks

Vet Center Services

- Readjustment counseling
- Military Sexual Trauma victims
- Bereavement counseling for active duty death
- Vet Center services provided to family members of Veterans and Service members for military related issues related to readjustment
- Humanitarian
- Also serves as a source of Information and Referral
- Services are the perfect price...FREE
- Do NOT need to be enrolled in VA Health Care

Vet Center Eligibility

- Any Veterans and active duty Service members, including members of National Guard and Reserve components, who:
 - Have served on active military duty in any combat theater or area of hostility
 - Experienced a military sexual trauma
 - Provided direct emergent medical care or mortuary services,
 while serving on active military duty, to the casualties of war
 - Served as member of unmanned aerial vehicle crew providing direct support to operations in a combat zone/area of hostility
 - Vietnam Era Vets accessing Vet Center care prior to 1 Jan 04
