PROCLAMATION

WOMEN VETERANS MONTH

March is Women Veteran/ Military Month in North Dakota WHEREAS, women have served honorably and courageously in all of America's wars and conflicts since the American Revolution; and

WHEREAS, the United States military has evolved from a predominantly male force to a force with more than 14 percent women who are currently serving on active duty, and nearly 17 percent who are serving in the Reserves and National Guard: and

WHEREAS, the population of women veterans is increasing exponentially, from 1.1 million in 1980 to a projected 2 million by 2020, comprising more than 10 percent of the veteran population; and

WHEREAS, North Dakota's veteran population includes more than 6,000 women: and

WHEREAS, with a rapidly increasing number of women serving in the military today and returning from deployments as seasoned veterans with exposure to combat, the Department of Veterans Affairs facilitates and veteran service offices and organizations across our state are working to ensure that the post-deployment mental and physical health needs unique to women veterans are being met: and

WHEREAS, women veterans are encouraged to reach out to the North Dakota Department of Veterans Affairs and its Women Veterans Coordinator, as well as County Veteran Service Officers and other veteran service organizations, to ensure their voices are heard and their unique healthcare and lifestyle issues are addressed, so that women veterans of all eras receive the services and benefits they deserve; and

WHEREAS, North Dakotans are encouraged to recognize the generations of women veterans who have proudly and valiantly served this great state and nation, and who have played an integral role in defending our homeland and preserving freedom around the world.

The presence of women in the military began more than 220 years ago with women who served during the American Revolution and continues through today.

Our countries female veterans make up over 1.8 million, in our state over 6000. We also thank and honor those that continue to serve.

North Dakota continues to honor our females who have served and continue to serve by proclaiming March as WOMEN VETERANS MONTH.

State Benefits Highlight: Veterans Aid Loan

The Veterans Aid Fund is a permanent fund to be used solely for the purpose of making loans to veterans or their widow/widowers.

To qualify, the applicant is required to be a veteran as defined under NDCC 37-14, or an un-remarried widow/widower of eligible veteran; a resident of North Dakota for at least one year, and have the financial ability to pay loan back.
